

Now operating as **UMAR**, **a Division of Monarch**, the organization joined Monarch's family of services in October 2023. With similar histories, Monarch and UMAR were each established when groups of caring and committed people came together to create community-based services where none previously existed. Now together, the two organizations have more than a century of leadership, experience and innovation providing programs and services supporting people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, their families and communities.

UMAR, a Division of Monarch, operates 18 group homes and three creative arts


centers, and provides community-based and vocational services, in Central and Western North Carolina. To learn more, **visit UMARNC.org**.

Kara and Emma the bulldog bring smiles to youth in crisis

When **Emma**, a seven-year-old English bulldog strolls into the SECU Youth Crisis Center (YCC), a Monarch program in Charlotte, things feel lighter and brighter as more smiles appear. With a sweet face and easy disposition, this trained therapy dog is just what the doctor ordered.

Kara Guerrieo, a member of Monarch's Board of Directors and volunteer, brings Emma by on Friday afternoons. Kara understands the challenges young people experiencing a mental health crisis face.

"Emma's job is to bring joy," Kara says.

Volunteering at Monarch is more than a pastime for Kara. Motivated by her late brother's struggle with bipolar disorder, Kara is committed to walking with people in their mental health journey; for the kids at YCC, that walk also includes Emma. Kara's volunteer work at Monarch is fueled by a dedication to improving mental health care and advocating for others.

Her advice to others who are considering volunteering at Monarch is simple. "Find passion and purpose in serving others because giving in any form can transform lives," she says.

Expanding Behavioral Health Services in Chatham County

In partnership with Vaya Health, we opened our new Behavioral Health Outpatient Office in Pittsboro in November 2023. Working with the people we support, Monarch's caring and experienced team of professionals develops a well-defined and customized plan that meets each individual's needs and goals.

Monarch's walk-in/open access provides:

- Same-day support to ensure immediate help
- Walk-in services for in-person support or virtual options
- A comprehensive clinical assessment with a therapist
- Immediate next steps via an appointment for the next service or a referral to the proper level of care
- Ongoing medication management
- Access to individual, group and family therapy

The Behavioral Health Outpatient Office is located at 193 Lowes Drive in Pittsboro, and also offers Mobile Crisis Management Services and Mobile Outreach, Response, Engagement and Stabilization (MORES) Services in Chatham County, rounding out a continuum of mental health care for the area.
